

Dairy Barn

Fact Sheet





Baltonsborough, Somerset

Directions: Once you have reached Burgess Lane. Drive along and you will come to one small house on the right. Keep going and you will come to the lay by for parking on the left-hand side. We kindly ask that you do not park on the left-hand side of the lane as this belongs to our neighbours. Once parked, get the key out of lock box which is on the front of the house (lane side). Head round the back to the terrace doors and let yourself in. We will send you the code for the lockbox prior to your arrival.

Stunning barn conversion surrounded by fields.

As you walk up to this barn conversion you will see Glastonbury Tor in the distance and the view over the fields. Tranquility at its best. There is something quite magical as you sit here. Inside has underfloor heating if needed and it has a lovely calm feel about the place. All the things you need and a well-equipped kitchen.

There is one large double bedroom. The living room has a sofa bed which would be ideal for one young child & not ideal for adults. There is also a junior bed or cot. The double bedroom is at one end of the property and the shower room at the other end (no bath tub). Lounge and kitchen area in the middle.

There is a sofa bed in the living area and a cot if needed. Ideally for two people on their own or with children.

The barn has under floor heating throughout and an electric fire in the lounge but really not needed with the underfloor heating!

The rental is for the whole barn. There is a parking bay that is ours and you can park up to three cars easily here.

Baltonsborough has so much history and the surrounding areas offers so much to do as well. Baltonsborough has one pub in the village which is a 5-minute walk. There are many other pubs as you drive towards Wells, Street and Glastonbury.

Parking:

As you drive down Burgess Lane you will see an opening onto a lay-by on the right-hand side. This is ours and you can park here. Please do not park on the left side on our neighbours land or in the lane.

Heating instructions:

The heating can be adjusted:

Bedroom: own room stat.

Bathroom and living room: near the router at the window there is a stat.

Recycling waste procedures:

Green box: glass, paper, and cans.

Black box: card and plastic bottles.

Large brown box: food waste.

Small brown box: day to day food waste. Please use a liner provided. When full, transfer this to the large brown box.

Black wheelie bin: all other waste. It would be helpful to use a bin bag.

The recycling boxes are collected each week. Please put out on Wednesday evening for early morning Thursday pick up.

Please leave the wheelie bin at the front of the building at all times. This is collected fortnightly.

Thank you for your help in aiding Somerset meet its recycling obligations.
